







# Our Amazing WOWs





# Bird Box Building Experience

# Looking for an original gift idea? How about a Bird Box Building Experience at Jennyruth Workshops?



Choose which style of bird box you want to make ....

Tit Box



**Robin Box** 



**Blackbird Box** 



... and decorate it using a range of stencils in colours of your choice.



We'll provide component parts, materials, tools and tuition - along with a sandwich lunch. Your unique bird box will be finished and ready to take home by 4pm

The day will include a tour of our workshop, as well as assembling and decorating your own bird box to take home.

Arriving at 10am, your experience will start with a hot drink and safety briefing. This will be followed by a tour of our workshop where you'll meet our 'workers', one of whom will show you around and guide you through the process of creating your own bird box.

Then it's off to the woodwork area where you'll sand the wooden components of your bird box, drill and screw the box together, assemble and fit the roof. You'll add finishing touches: roofing felt, a hanging hook, and one of our trademark wrens.

After lunch you'll move on to the paint shop where you'll be able to stencil on decorations to make your bird box truly unique.

This experience is suitable for adults aged 18+.

The cost of £99 per person includes all you'll need to make your bird box and will help support our workshop. Experiences are available Monday to Friday 10am-4pm. All materials, tools and safety boots will be supplied for the day.

The experience is for one person to attend. It is possible to book 2 experiences so that 2 people (max.) can attend together, each making their own box. Please contact us to enquire about similar experiences for larger groups.

Our workshop is near Ripon HG4 5AY. Parking on site.






# Cooks Corner

Cooks Corner has been taken over by the Baking Group this month with delicious recipes of Savoury Leek and Ham Muffins and Carrot and Coriander Soup.

### Ingredients

1 tbsp vegetable oil
1 chopped onion
1 tsp ground coriander
1 chopped potato
450g peeled and chopped carrots
1.2L vegetable stock
handful of coriander




#### STEP 1

Heat the vegetable oil in a large pan, add the onion then fry for 5 mins until softened.

#### STEP 2

Stir in the ground coriander and potato then cook for 1 min.



### STEP 3

Add the carrots and vegetable stock, bring to the boil, then reduce the heat.

#### STEP 4


Cover and cook for 20mins until the carrots are tender.

#### STEP 5

Tip into a food processor with a handful of corinader then blitz until smooth.

#### STEP 6

Return to pan, taste and add salt if necessary, then reheat to serve.



#### STEP 1

Pre heat oven 200 degrees/Gas Mark 6. Fill a muffin tin with 12 muffin paper liners. Heat the oil in a frying pan, add the leek and cook, stirring, over a low heat for 2 mins. Remove from heat and cool.

#### STEP 2

Sift the flour, baking powder and baking soda into a large mixing bowl. In a separate bowl, lightly mix the egg, yogurt and melted butter together. Add the cheese, chives, leek and half of the ham, then mix together. Add the cheese mixture to the flour mixture, then gently stir together until just combined. Do not overstep the batter.

#### STEP 3

Divide the batter evenly between the muffin cases (they should be about two-thirds full. Bake them in the oven for 20 mins or until risen and golden. Remove the muffins from the oven and serve warm or leave to cool.


